METHOD FOR STUDYING CASES FOR DISCERNMENT

- 1. Serious study of Ignatius' Rules of Discernment of Spirits. The questions for reflection accompanying each case are intended to call attention to some element of Ignatius' teaching.
- 2. Read attentively the statement of the case history to be studied.
- 3. Think through and write out your response to each question for reflection posed after the statement of the particular case be studied. If there are any questions you cannot answer, leave them for step #4. While discernment of spirits is essential to spiritual direction, it does not encompass all that is essential to it. There might be other questions that the director might wish to take up with the person.
- 4. The pages refer to the commentary and notes. They serve to give some leads to the main teachings of Ignatius.
- 5. Reflect on the suggestions about the cases found in this book.
- 6. Process your insights with a group or another person who has also completed the above process.
